Executive Summary

- **Objective:** Enhance Coconut Creek Fire Rescue (CCFR) and Coconut Creek Police Department (CCPD) by reducing opioid-related crimes, improving emergency response, improving treatment of opioid-related patients, and supporting CCFR and CCPD opioid-related initiatives.
- Overview: This implementation plan outlines how the City of Coconut Creek, specifically CCFR and CCPD, intends to allocate and utilize the opioid settlement funds in alignment with the requirements of Schedules A and B of the opioid settlement. This plan details the specific areas of focus and the amount of funds dedicated to each area.
- Goals: Decrease opioid distribution and misuse, improve safety for first responders, and support affected communities through effective public safety strategies.

2. Needs Assessment

- Data Analysis: Review current trends with opioid-related Emergency Medical Services calls with fire rescue. Review local crime statistics related to opioid use, such as drug trafficking, thefts, and overdoses.
- **Resource Inventory:** Assess current law enforcement and fire rescue capabilities, emergency response resources, and community safety programs to identify gaps and needs.

3. Strategic Priorities

Training and Resources:

- CCPD Training Programs: Provide comprehensive training on handling opioid-related incidents, including identification, treatment with naloxone intranasal, de-escalation, and evidence collection.
- CCPD Equipment and Technology: Supply law enforcement with necessary equipment, such as protective gear, overdose kits (naloxone), advanced training techniques, and advanced real-life mannequins to provide scenario-based training.
- CCFR Training Programs: Provide comprehensive training on handling opioid-related incidents, including identification, and train on advanced patient assessment techniques.

 CCFR Equipment and Technology: Supply fire rescue with necessary equipment, such as protective gear, overdose kits (naloxone), advanced drug detection technology, advanced training techniques, and advanced real-life mannequins to provide scenario-based training.

• Emergency Response and Overdose Prevention:

- CCFR: Continue to equip CCFR personnel with the latest and most up-todate equipment to exceed industry standards as it pertains to emergency overdoses.
- CCPD: Continue to equip CCPD personnel with the latest and most up-todate equipment to exceed industry standards as it pertains to emergency overdoses.
- Community Outreach: Conduct public education safety campaigns to educate
 the community on overdose prevention and reporting suspicious activities. Provide
 a brief summary of Narcan administration during CCFR monthly CPR classes.
 - CCPD: Provide carrying pouches for Narcan on all officers' vests for rapid deployment of an overdose emergency. Provide Narcan via a wall-mounted box located in the Police Department for overdose emergencies.
 - CCFR: Provide modern training mannequins to administer Narcan during an overdose emergency.

4. Budget Allocation

Schedule A Allocation: \$4,845.05Schedule B Allocation: \$60,459.71

Total Settlement Funds Utilized: \$65,304.76

5. Implementation Plan

Timeline:

- Q1 (Oct-Dec 2024): Procure necessary equipment and supplies. Distribute naloxone to first responders. Initiate first responder training programs.
- Q2 (Jan-Mar 2025): Launch public safety campaigns, prevention programs, and public awareness campaigns.
- Q3 (Apr-Jun 2025): Continue public safety and outreach initiatives.
- Q4 (Jul-Sep 2025): Full implementation and evaluation of all funded programs. Evaluate program effectiveness, adjust strategies as needed,

and prepare for sustained efforts and the creation of the implementation plan for FY26.

Responsible Parties:

- CCPD: Oversee training and enforcement operations.
- CCFR: Oversee training and enforcement operations.
 - CCFR Community Outreach: Implement outreach and support programs.
- **Collaboration:** Foster partnerships with surrounding law enforcement, fire rescue, public health agencies, and community organizations to ensure comprehensive and coordinated efforts.

6. Monitoring and Evaluation

- Overview: Quarterly financial and performance reporting will be conducted to
 ensure the effectiveness of this funded program. CCFR's Assistant Chief of
 Administration in collaboration with CCPD's Accreditation Manager will oversee
 this monitoring. Comprehensive performance reports, detailing progress,
 challenges, outcomes, and any necessary adjustments to the implementation plan,
 will be submitted to the City's Finance and Legal Department. This rigorous
 evaluation process will ensure accountability and continuous improvement of the
 program.
- **Regular Reporting:** Require quarterly reports from funded programs to monitor progress and make data-driven adjustments.
- **Evaluation:** Conduct an annual review to assess the effectiveness of funded initiatives and identify areas for improvement.

Conclusion This implementation plan provides a comprehensive approach to utilizing the opioid settlement funds in a manner that aligns with the stipulations of Schedules A and B. By focusing on law enforcement, fire rescue, and community support, the Opioid Settlement Funds Implementation Plan for FY25 aims to enhance public safety and mitigate the impact of the opioid crisis.
