Scope of Work and desired outcome:

1. Purchase of an ambulance is dependent on competitive procurement – to support mobile intervention by responding to overdose patients who are in need of treatment and connecting those patients to other services, such as a hospital emergency department. Gulf County is a small, rural, fiscally constrained county and considered a rural area of opportunity. It is important for the County to provide our residents and visitors with access to optimal emergency medical services. Therefore, it is vital to utilize any funding opportunities available to provide assistance in areas where the County experiences funding shortfalls. Desired Outcome: to provide better access of care to overdose patients and potentially increase the number of patients who present to a hospital emergency department to seek additional care or treatment.
