Gulf County is a small, rural, fiscally constrained county and considered a rural area of opportunity. It is important for the County to provide our residents and visitors with access to optimal emergency medical services. Therefore, it is vital to utilize any funding opportunities available to provide assistance in areas where the County experiences funding shortfalls. Desired Outcome: to provide better access of care to overdose patients and potentially increase the number of patients who present to a hospital emergency department to seek additional care or treatment.
